- Link the six new standards for the teaching profession to learning outcomes and evidence for your portfolio

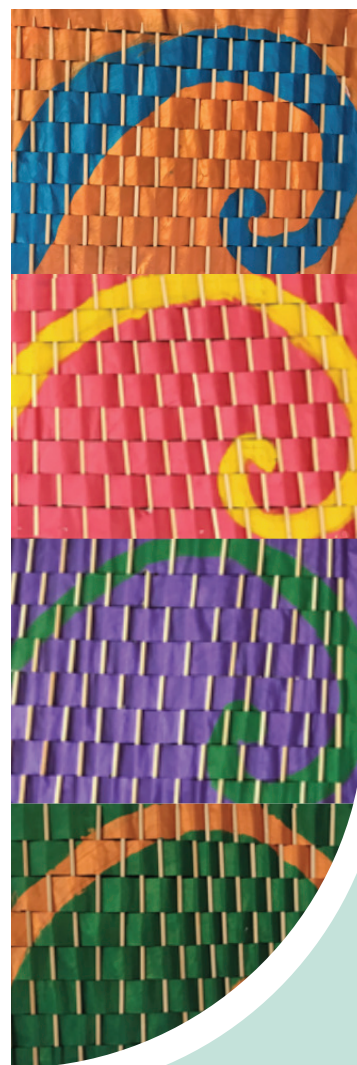
